DEEPEN.

Read **Philippians 3:4b-14**

Keep in mind that before he was the Apostle Paul, he was Saul of Tarsus who passionately persecuted Christians. His personal encounter with Jesus changed his life and he became a passionate disciple of Christ sharing his life and the gospel with others.

1. Sounds like Paul might be boasting through the first 3 verses of this passage but what does he say about these “achievements” in verses 7-8?
2. What is more valuable to Paul than all he had accomplished in his life?
3. What have you given up in order to have more of Christ – to know him and his power? What are you holding on to that you might need to give up to have more of Christ?
4. Paul’s goal was to know Christ, to be like Christ, and to be all God had in mind for him. What might hold someone back or distract them from this type of goal? What has held or currently holds you back?

Read **Matthew 28:18-20**

These are Jesus’ last words of instruction to his disciples before his death.

1. What 3 things does he tell his disciples to do after assuring them that he has “been given all authority in heaven and on earth”?
2. Does this apply to us too? How do you know?
3. What is a disciple and how do we go about “making disciples”?
4. Share an example of someone who lived this out and helped teach you what it looks like to follow Christ.
5. Have you been able to do this for someone? How?
6. The last sentence is a promise from Jesus. How does this promise encourage you to “go and make disciples”?

PRAY

It is not ourselves that we proclaim; we proclaim Christ Jesus as Lord, and ourselves as your servants, for Jesus’ sake. For the same God who said, “Out of darkness let light shine,” has caused his light to shine within us, to give the light of revelation-- the revelation of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.
